To allocate financial assistance to athletes, team members, judges, officials, coaches and team leaders attending local, intrastate events, interstate events, Australian Championships and international events.

ISQ supports and encourages our Queensland skaters to gain experience and attend competitions. ISQ strives for our athletes to achieve results at national and international events.

ISQ recognises its reliance on Judges, Officials, Coaches and Team Leaders, to support and administer the sport locally, intrastate, interstate and internationally & financially supports those endeavours.

Conditions:

- (1) Recipients of the above assistance must be current financial members of ISQ for at least 24 consecutive months prior to requesting funding, or if a re-joining member, previous membership must be a minimum of 5 years.
- (2) For dance and pair couples, both members must be current financial ISQ members at the time of the event and the request for funding. One member must meet the length of time requirements for ISQ membership.
- (3) Application for assistance (excl. entry fees) should be made upon return from the event & against original receipts. Assistance is only for entry fees and actual out of pocket travel and accommodation expenses (GST receipts for all domestic exp). Assistance for air fares will only be provided for the reasonable cost of an economy air fare at the time of travel. Application must be made on the ISQ Financial Assistance Application form available on the ISQ website or from the ISQ Administrator.
- (4) Only available to ISA and/or ISQ nominated/endorsed participants. Members should ensure that ISQ is aware of travel prior to travelling to events. Athletes must be representing Qld/Australia (as relevant) and coaches must be attending to coach an athlete representing Qld/Australia (as relevant).
- (5) All claims must be made within 3 months of the final day of the relevant competition.
- (6) Synchronized team members must have represented ISQ at a qualifying Australian Championship.
- (7) For synchronized skating, interstate top-up team members receive no funding unless they comply with (6) & (1).
- (8) Example of Nationals funding: If a judge advises they were available Saturday, Sunday and Monday, the judge would be entitled to \$400 (out of pocket travel/accommodation expenses) plus \$300 (out of pocket accommodation expenses). The \$100 per available day funding is for each day the Judge/Technical Official makes themselves available to assist at the Championships.
- (9) Skaters in Advanced Novice and above who are applying for financial assistance pursuant to this policy for international competitions (including JGPs, Challenger Series, 4 Continents, Grand Prix's, Junior and Senior World Championships must have a detailed training plan for the current season in place, provided to ISQ by 31 January each year.
- (10) Skaters and synchronized teams receiving funding to attend International Competitions, Jnr Grand Prix Events, Four Continents, Grand Prix Events, Junior and Senior Worlds must provide to the ISQ Administrator a brief report of the competition and their experience promptly on their return from the competition.
- (11) As part of your travel claim, ISQ will contribute toward travel insurance costs, up to the value of \$110 or to the cost of the ISA policy when/if the ISA travel insurance is re-instated.
- (12) Addition funding required for obtaining ISU scores will be considered on a case by case basis by the ISQ Council.
- (13) Where athletes and coaches are eligible for funding for two competitions, but attend these in one trip, the maximum funding available will be 80% of the total funding ordinarily available.

(14) Funding to attend ISU Development Camps will only be considered on submission of the ISU Development Camp Application form. Singles must have achieved an ISA Benchmark Score. Pairs and Dance Couples must have been skating together for at least 12 months and have achieved an ISA Benchmark score. Synchronized skaters must have been a member of the same synchronized team for at least 12 months, and the team must have achieved an ISA Benchmark.

Conditions:

- (1) Can be claimed for performance in one Division only.
- (2) For Synchronized placing – recognition reward is per team.
- (3) Eligibility for payment is based on achievement of the criteria published from time to time which includes minimum scores.

JUDGES / OFFICIALS

Assistance with transport costs to Events, Testing and other ISQ Council pre-approved initiatives.

- Claimants must advise of any other funding received for the same event.
- Assistance for Local Events: \$50 to attend at either ISQ Rink from GC or vice versa to GC Rink from Brisbane, paid bi-annually through Judging Committee.
- Assistance for Local Events: \$30 to attend ISQ rinks from within Brisbane paid bi-annually through Judging Committee.
